WEEK 1 | 1 Samuel 17:34-37

God helped David, a shepherd, save his sheep from both a lion and a bear!

WEEK 3 | 1 Samuel 18:7, 12-14

David sang and danced for God because God had helped him win battles. Then, king Saul sent David into yet more battles. God help David win in all of them.

WEEK 2 | 1 Samuel 16:1-13

God helped Samuel choose the boy who would be the new king. Samuel looked at all of Jesse's sons before choosing David. God didn't care how the brothers looked or how strong they were. He chose David because David had a heart for God.

WEEK 4 | Exodus 5:1-6:8

The Israelites had to work hard and make bricks all day for Pharaoh. Moses cried to God to help the Israelites, and He said He would help them.

PLAY TIME: Use your child's plush or plastic animals to retell the story of David and the lion and bear. The lion and the bear tried to take a sheep, but God helped David to save the sheep

from the lion and bear. God can help me do anything! After telling the story several times, have your child tell it.



CAR TIME: While driving around town this month, talk about things that are really hard to do. It's really hard to learn to tie our shoes. Who can help you? God can help me

do anything. It's really hard to eat our veggies sometimes. Who can help you? God can help me do anything.



BATH TIME: Give your child a bubble bath one day this month. While in the bath, see if they can make bricks out of the bubbles like the Israelites

had to make bricks out of mud and straw. Can they make a big tower of bubbles? Making bubble bricks is fun, but making real bricks is hard. Who did Moses ask to help the Israelites? He asked God to help. God can help me do anything.



PARENT TIME:

God loves us. He loves us and He wants to help us. He wants to help us with the easy stuff and the hard stuff. He especially wants to help us fight for our child's heart.
